We pray for those who make decisions over life and death, and for those who seek death – whether it be for others or for themselves. That they may opt for life, not death, for hope and not despair, for peace and not for war.

We pray for those who are sick, those who are dying, especially those who die alone. That our words of hope and comfort may turn their desperate plight into journeys of faith, and God's healing power can touch their lives.

We turn to Our Lady, who rejoices with Elizabeth at the lives that are within them, and we pray, Hail Mary...

God our Father, we give thanks for hearing our prayers. May we joyfully give witness to the Risen Lord in our lives, so that others may come to know and cherish the very gift of life. We make these prayers through Christ our Lord.
